Dog Policy Form

We are pleased to welcome you and your dog to the Sandcastle Hotel on the Beach. To ensure your dog's safety and comfort during your stay, please review and sign our Pet Policy.

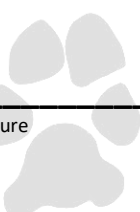
- Your dog is also our guest. All dogs at the Sandcastle Hotel on the Beach must be registered.
- There is a **\$120 plus tax non-refundable fee** per stay for having your dog in your room. This fee is per room and not per dog. This fee will be charged to your account prior to checkout.
- We allow a maximum of two well-behaved dogs (*sorry, no cats or exotic pets*). We also reserve the right to refuse housing to any dog at our sole discretion for any reason. Other pets are considered on a case by case basis and are accepted at the discretion of the management team.
- Dogs may **NOT** be left unattended anywhere on the property. Never leave your dog alone inside your guest room. While outside of your guest room, please make sure your dog is on a leash at all times.
- A dog in an unfamiliar environment may occasionally bark. Please quiet an excited pet as soon as possible. You may be required to leave if repeated barking complaints are received from other guests
- Please do not let your dog up on the bed or furniture, thank you. A pet bed is provided to rooms with pets.
- Dogs are not permitted inside of our bistro, The Deck, per county health codes. If you bring your furry friend to the bistro, there are outside patio tables and seating located on the oceanside of the bistro for you to enjoy your meal with them. Service animals only permitted inside restaurant. A Pup Menu is available at our bistro.
- Please clean up after your pet and dispose of waste properly and in a timely manner.
- Pets must be clean of fleas, ticks or other pests. Current vaccination certificates may be requested as deemed necessary by the management.

- You are responsible for any property damage, cleaning costs, personal injury, pest control, or noise disturbance caused by your pet. The hotel reserves the right to charge your account commensurate with the estimated cost of such damages. If your pet has a urine or stool accident the cleaning charge is \$250.00.

DOG-FRIENDLY BEACHES ABOUND IN SLO COUNTY

He may not need to work on his tan, but your dog enjoys a day at the beach just as much as you do. So rather than leaving Fido at home, bring them along for some fun in the sun. SLO County is full of dog-friendly beaches; some are well-known, and others are well-kept secrets. Here are some that options that you'll want to check out:

Pismo Beach/Oceano Dunes

You can enjoy a spectacular sunset stroll with your canine companion in Pismo Beach. To ensure everyone's safety and enjoyment, please keep your dog on a leash at all times. Pismo Beach is dog-friendly at any time of day. If your dog doesn't like sand between his paws, Dinosaur Caves Park lies right on the bluffs of Shell Beach (north of Pismo). The ocean views from this 11-acre park are extraordinary. On the other hand, if he likes to toss around in the sand dunes, head down the Pacific Coast Highway, and you can roam with Rover around Oceano Dunes State Park, as long as you stay within the park and keep him leashed.



Pismo Preserve

Lace up your hiking boots and leash up your furry friend for a fantastic adventure at the Pismo Preserve! This stunning coastal property boasts miles of dog-friendly trails that wind through rolling hills and offer breathtaking panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean. For the safety and consideration of all visitors and the preservation of this natural space, dogs must be kept on a leash at all times. Please be sure to follow all trail rules as posted on signs throughout the preserve and remember to clean up after your pet to help keep this beautiful area pristine for everyone to enjoy. Bring water for both you and your dog and get ready to explore the beauty of the Central Coast together!



Avila Beach

As you head up the 101, stop in Avila Beach for several dog-friendly options. Before 10 am and after 5 pm daily, you can enjoy sunny Avila Beach. If your furry friend is a free spirit, Avila also has some leash-free options! The Olde Port Beach, next to Harford Pier, and the Fisherman's Beach, nicknamed "Dog Beach," both have a leash-optional policy, meaning that your dog can run wild and burn off some of those dog treats.



Montaña de Oro

If you're heading north, follow Los Osos Valley Road to the coast, and continue onto Pecho Valley Road to explore the untouched majesty of Montaña de Oro State Park, where you and your dog can spend some time at Spooner's Cove. This beach is one of those hidden treasures for dog-owners that remains undiscovered to all but the most experienced dog owners.
