The new wintertime program features a trio of

tracks: the Creator's Path for creatives; the Grounded Executive for leaders in business or nonprofits; and the Restorative Reset for anyone who is facing change or burnout.

Guests spend anywhere from three to six weeks at the resort's private cottages and cabins with access to chef-prepared meals, yoga, massage, guided nature walks or snowshoeing, workshops in journaling and painting, plus conservation tours.

"This was driven by our employees, who wanted people to experience Vermejo like they do – well beyond three to four days," says Jade McBride, president of Ted Turner Reserves, the hospitality arm of Turner Enterprises.
